Media Advisory: Major Latrell Simmons Graduates the FBI National Academy

Sheriff Sadie Darnell is pleased to announce and congratulate Major Latrell Simmons on his graduation from the 267th Session of the FBI (Federal Bureau of Investigation) National Academy. Major Simmons current assignment is as the Major of Operations. Major Simmons joins Sheriff Darnell, Colonel David Huckstep and Captain Steve Maynard as active duty graduates of this prestigious command school.

Major Simmons graduated March 17th, 2017, along with two hundred twenty seven other law enforcement professionals in Quantico, Virginia. The 267th Session of the National Academy consisted of men and women from 48 states. Included in the class are members of law enforcement agencies from the District of Columbia, 25 international countries, three military organizations, and eight federal civilian organizations.

Internationally known for its academic excellence, the National Academy Program, held at the FBI Academy, offers ten weeks of advanced communication, leadership, and fitness training for selected officers having proven records as professionals within their agencies. On average, these officers have 21 years of law enforcement experience and usually return to their agencies to serve in executive-level positions.

FBI Director James Comey was the principal speaker at the ceremony.

Training for the program is provided by the FBI Academy instructional staff, Special Agents, and other staff members holding advanced degrees, many of whom are recognized internationally in their fields of expertise.
